



# BUCS YACHTING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2015 NOTICE OF RACE 28<sup>th</sup> March – 2nd April 2015

# 1 ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

- 1.1 The Organizing Authority is the Portsmouth Harbour Yacht Club and the British Universities Sailing Association (BUSA).

## 2 RULES

- The Regatta will be governed by:
- 2.1 The Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016 (RRS).
- 2.2 Sunsail F40 Class Rules.
- 2.3 RRS Appendix D (Team Racing Rules) will not apply.
- 2.4 For the purpose of this regatta the word team may be used to mean the crew of a boat. The word boat and yacht are interchangeable.

## 3 NAVIGATION RESTRICTIONS, SAFETY REGULATIONS AND COMMUNICATONS

Boats shall comply with:

- 3.1 ISAF Offshore Special Regulations Category 4.
- 3.2 The Southampton Bye-Laws 10 and 11 and ABP Southampton Notice to Mariners Number 4 of 2004. A yacht infringing this instruction shall be disqualified (which shall be non-excludable (DNE)) without a hearing (changing rules 63.1 and 90.3(b)) except that she shall be entitled to a hearing on request.
- 3.3 The Southampton, Portsmouth Harbour byelaws where applicable.

## 4 ENTRIES AND YACHTS

- 4.1 Entries will only be accepted via the BUCScore online entry system. The charter document must be completed on BUCScore. The invoice or purchase order will be sent to the club, when their entry is accepted for £1500.00 Charter Fee and £3000.00 Security Deposit (Payable via BACS or Cheque, to Sunsail Worldwide Sailing Ltd, Personal cheques will not be accepted. Cheques will be cashed). Entries must be received by Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2015. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority, subject to the availability of boats.
- 4.2 The event is open to teams of **<u>EIGHT</u>** people all of whom must sail on the boat while racing, which must include at least two females.
- 4.3 The Skipper/Helm for each team must have a minimum of 500nm Racing experience in order to charter a boat from Sunsail. At least 2 members of the team must hold a valid RYA Day Skipper Practical qualification or equivalent keelboat racing experience.
- 4.4 The number of teams is limited to the number of boats made available by Sunsail. Places will be allocated by BUSA, based on:
  - (i) Meeting the required experience set out by Sunsail Charter agreement.
  - (ii) One place per university, on a first come, first served basis in the order that entries are received.
  - (iii) All other places filled on a first come, first served basis in the order that entries are received.
- 4.5 A Sunsail F40 will be chartered to each team. The allocation of boats will be by a draw. Any consequences of the allocation including the supply, condition and maintenance of a boat and her equipment shall not comprise grounds for seeking redress (affecting RRS 62.1 (a)).
- 4.6 For an entry can be considered as valid, teams must complete all the required charter and entry information on BUCScore (i.e. Skipper and experienced crew). The final and full **crew list must be submitted on BUCScore by the 5<sup>th</sup> March 2015.**

## 5 PROGRAMME

- 5.1 Registration. All Crew members must register in person at Port Solent between 1700 and 1900 on Sunday 28th March 2015. The yachts will be allocated by draw and a hand over and inventory check must be conducted on the allocated yacht. Failure to do so may render a team liable for previously caused damage or loss to a yacht or her equipment. Sunsail staff will be on hand to assist. At registration and until 1900 on the 28th March 2015 competitors shall produce their University Registration Card to the OA (NUS cards will not be sufficient).
- 5.2 Boat Collection will be from 1900 2100.
- 5.3 Skippers Briefing. This will take place at 1900 on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2015 at the Portsmouth Harbour Yacht Club.
- 5.4 It is the intention of the Organizing Authority that the regatta will consist of a qualifying series and a final series. The Qualifying series is scheduled for Monday to Wednesday. The final series is scheduled for Thursday. The Final series may be bought forward at the discretion of the Race Committee.

All boats will be assigned to the same fleet during the qualifying series. Boats will be assigned to the final series fleets Gold and Silver, based on their rank in the qualifying series. Details of fleet assignments and starts will be described in the Sl's.

## 6 ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1 To be eligible each competitor must meet the BUCS General Regulations (<u>Reg 7 Eligibility</u>). All competitors must be from an institution which is currently affiliated and in good standing with the British Universities Sailing Association.
- 6.2 International entries may be accepted at the discretion of the OA and would only be accepted after the closing date for entries, if there is space.

## 7 SCORING

- 7.1 The sailing instructions will modify RRS A.2 regarding discounted races for the qualifying and final series scoring.
- 7.2 10 races are scheduled of which 2 must be completed for the event to qualify as a championship. 8 races are scheduled for the qualifying series. If 2 or less races are completed all races shall count in a boats qualifying series score. If 3 or more races are completed in the qualifying series a boats qualifying series score shall be

the total of her race scores excluding her worst score except that it will not be possible to discard the Inshore coastal and the Long Inshore race (if raced).

7.3 Each final series fleet shall be scored separately. Different final series fleets need not have completed the same number of final races. The boats in the Gold fleet will be ranked highest in the regatta. All races in the final series will count towards a boats final series score.
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A boats regatta score shall be points equal to her qualifying series score, following any discards plus her final series score.

#### 8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 Sailing Instructions may be available from the official website from **17<sup>th</sup> March 2015** <u>www.busa.co.uk</u>. Printed copies will be available at Registration.

#### 9 COURSES

- 9.1 Courses will be laid in the Eastern, Central and Western Solent area using fixed or specially laid marks. Races 6 and 8 will be coastal and a long inshore race.
- 9.2 The Practice Race will start in the Eastern Solent at 1000 hrs prompt.
- 9.3 The Race Committee reserves the right to alter the date for the Long Inshore Race subject to weather conditions.

#### **10 PROTEST COMMITTEE**

- 10.1 A Protest Committee will be appointed in accordance with RRS 91.
- 10.2 A boat may not protest under the Class Rules (changes RRS 60.1(a)).

#### 11 SOCIAL PROGRAMME will be announced in March 2015.

#### 12 RISK STATEMENT

- **12.1** A boat and team are entirely responsible for their own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions or anywhere else, reduces this responsibility.
- **12.2** Competitors' attention is particularly drawn to rule 4: *"The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".*
- **12.3** Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the Championship, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
  - **12.3.1** they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the Championship;
  - **12.3.2** they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
  - **12.3.3** they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
  - **12.3.4** they are fit to participate in the Championship and, before racing in any boats supplied to them, they will satisfy themselves that such boats are in good order and equipped to race in the Championship;
  - **12.3.5** the provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and any other officials and volunteers does not relieve them of their responsibilities; and
  - **12.3.6** the provision of any patrol boat or other official boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

#### 13 PRIZES

- 13.1 The top English, Scottish and Welsh teams from this event may be invited to the Student Yachting Worlds 2015 (providing they are eligible to race with no crew changes). If the winning team are ineligible to compete then a runner up may be offered an invite. The decision of the British Universities Sailing Association General Committee is final and such a decision is not grounds for redress at this event (changes rule 62).
- 13.2 BUCS points and medals will be awarded.
- 13.3 The winner of the Long Inshore Race (if raced) will be awarded the Jim Saltonstall Teapot Trophy.
