



## British Universities Sailing Associations National Match Racing Championships 2010

23/24/25 April 2010  
Island Sailing Club, Cowes, Isle of Wight

### Preliminary Notice of Race

#### 1. The Organising Authority

The Organising Authority will be the British Universities Sailing Association (in association with the British Universities & Colleges Sport) and in conjunction with the Island Sailing Club.

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rule of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association shall apply.
- 1.3 The Rules and Regulations of the British Universities & Colleges Sport shall apply.
- 1.4 The byelaws of Island Sailing Club shall apply.

#### 2. Event Grading

ISAF Grade 4 status has been applied for the Finals

This grading is subject to review by the ISAF Match Race Advisory Board. The event may be re-graded when there is clear reason to do so.

#### 3. Provisional Programme

- 3.1
  - a) The Race Office will be open from 0800 on each day of the events.
  - b) Registration from 0800 on the first day of each event.
  - c) Crew weighing to be completed by 0900 on the first day of each event.
  - d) Practice may be available on the day prior to each event. Contact the Island Sailing Club (Tel: 01983 296621) for availability and costs (conditions apply, subject to availability).
  - e) First briefing will be at 0900 on the first day of each event.
  - f) First briefing with umpires will be immediately on completion of the first briefing.
  - g) Racing days will be Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
  - h) The time of the first race on the first day will be 1000 and for the subsequent day(s) 0930.
  - i) Daily press conference 60 minutes after the completion of the final race of the day.
  - j) Prize giving on completion of the Sunday press conference.

#### 4. Skippers Eligibility

- a) A maximum of 16 skippers will be invited. Only skippers invited by the O.A. will be eligible to enter the appropriate event. The O.A. intends to invite one team per university to enter on a first come first served basis. Second teams may be invited, if space, after the deadline for entry has passed, if they have completed the entry requirements and on a first come first served basis.
- b) To remain eligible a skipper shall confirm acceptance of invitation in writing, fax or e-mail.
- c) A non-returnable entry fee of £450 (payable to BUSA) shall accompany the acceptance of invitation, for this to be valid.
- d) All crews shall be from the same institution in accordance with the British Universities and Colleges Sports rules and regulations. (University registration cards will be required when the crew weigh in, NUS cards will not be adequate.)
- e) All competitors shall meet with the eligibility requirements of ISAF Regulation 19.2.

- f) All skippers shall obtain an ISAF Sailor ID by registering online [www.sailing.org/sailor](http://www.sailing.org/sailor). Skippers shall inform the O.A. of their ISAF Sailor ID before registration.

## 5 Entries

- 5.1 The skipper shall be entered on completion of registration, crew weighing and the payment of all fees and deposits. All payments shall be made by sterling or cheque.
- 5.2 Entry Fee
  - A non-returnable entry fee of £450 shall be paid with the entry to the British Universities Sailing Association. The closing date for entries will be at 4pm on the 26<sup>th</sup> February 2010.
- 5.3 Damage Deposit
  - a) An initial damage deposit of £750.00 shall be paid upon entry, payable to the Island Sailing Club. This deposit is the maximum payable by the skipper as a result of any one incident.
  - b) In the event that a deduction from the damage deposit is decided by the O.A., it may require the deposit be restored to its original amount before the skipper will be permitted to continue in the event.
  - c) Any remaining deposit after the event will be refunded within the 14 days after the event.

## 6 Rules

- 6.1 a) The event will be governed by the current rules as defined in the RRS, and include Match Racing Appendix C.
- b) The 'Rules for the Handling of Boats' will apply, and will also apply to any practice sailing. Class rules shall not apply.
- c) The National Authority prescriptions shall apply.
- d) The bye-laws of Island Sailing Club shall apply. **(Note: A personal flotation device must be worn whilst afloat.)**

## 7 Boats and Sails

- a) The event will be sailed in Sonar's using symmetrical spinnakers.
- b) 9 boats will be provided.
- c) The following sails will be provided for each boat:- Mainsail, Jib and symmetrical spinnaker.
- d) Boats will be allocated by draw either daily or for each round as decided by the Race Committee.
- e) Upper wind strength limitations may determine whether the fleet can race.

## 9. Crew (including skipper)

- a) Team shall consist of between 3 and 5 sailors (including the skipper).
- b) All registered crew shall sail all races.
- c) The maximum total crew weight for the event determined prior to racing shall be 340kg, when wearing at least shorts and shirt.
- d) The registered skipper shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency.
- e) When a registered skipper is unable to continue in the event, the Jury/O.A. may authorise an original crew member to substitute.
- f) When a registered crew member is unable to continue in the event, the Jury/O.A. may authorise a temporary substitute or other adjustment.

## 10. Event Format

- a) Skippers will be seeded based on the most recently published ISAF ranking list 14 days before the appropriate event.
- b) The event will consist of the following stages:-
  - Series 1 - Single Round Robin
  - Series 2 - Semi-Finals
  - Series 3 - Finals
- c) The O.A. may change the format, terminate or eliminate any round, when conditions do not permit the completion of the intended format.

**11. Course**

- a) The course will be windward/leeward with starboard roundings, finishing downwind.
- b) The intended course area will be announced at the first briefing.

**12. Prizes**

- a) BUCS Points will be awarded to the top 8 teams.
- b) Prizes may be awarded to the top 3 teams.
- c) The Winner may be invited to the RYA National Match Racing Championship Finals in October 2010.
- d) The O.A. may reduce a prize in the case of misconduct or refusal to comply with any reasonable request, including attendance at official functions.

**13. Media, Images and Sound**

The O.A. may require television personnel and equipment (or dummies) to be carried on board while racing and may require competitors to be available for interviews. The O.A. shall have the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of any charge.

**14. Coach Boats**

- a) Coach boats shall conspicuously display identification of the team being coached.
- b) The organisers will not provide berths for coach boats.
- c) Any interference by a coach boat with the racing or event organisation may result in a penalty applied at the discretion of the Jury /Protest Committee to the appropriate skipper or team.

**15. Disclaimer**

**Identification and Acknowledgement of Risk**

Skippers and crew should be fully aware and conscious of the actual and potential risks involved in active watersports, including drowning, hypothermia and other physical injuries including head injuries. Skippers and crew should be aware of particular risks of match racing where yachts are manoeuvred in close proximity and that the actions of other competitors, the actions or inactions of the organisers, including drivers of escort craft, can also endanger their safety.

The safety of the yacht and her crew and her entire management are the sole responsibility of the skipper and he/she should satisfy him/herself that the yacht and crew are adequate to face the conditions that may arise in the course of the Event.
